DECLARATION OF OPEN AND CLOSED SEASONS FOR WILDLIFE

The Guyana Wildlife Conservation and Management Commission has declared the following periods to be open and closed seasons for various categories of wildlife:

BIRDS

SPECIES	CLOSED SEASON	OPEN SEASON
Ibises (Ibidae)	1 January – 31 August	1 September – 31 December
Psittacines	1 December – 31 May	1 June – 30 November
Ducks (Anatidae)	1 April – 30 September	1 October – 31 March

REPTILES

SPECIES	CLOSED SEASON	OPEN SEASON
Red-footed tortoise (Chelonoidis carbonaria)	1 April – 31 July with restriction on carapace size i.e. maximum harvest length of 10cm SCL (straight carapace length)	1 August – 31 March
Green Iguana (Iguana iguana)	1 May – 31 July	1 August – 30 April
