



### What are the requirements for obtaining a licence?

- A filled Application Form
- **National Identification Card or Passport (original** and copy, back and front)
- Two (2) recent Passport size photos
- TIN Certificate (Original and Copy)
- Firearm Licence (Original and Copy) for **Recreational Hunters only**
- Show proof of having adequate housing for trapped wildlife (for trappers and middlemen)
- Food Handling Certificate (Restaurants, cookshops, rum-shops/bars)
- Pay an Application Processing Fee


